2020 Special Events Report

Special Events was pleased to be able to continue the tradition of hosting volunteer led community-based activities this summer.

In advance of the season we had planned for a robust summer of events inclusive of a large ballfield tent dance celebrating Quonnie's 90th anniversary year. However due to these uncertain times many discussions ensued, and we adjusted year 2020 to a smaller list of flexible activities that could adhere to RI's evolving COVID-19 guidelines on safe gatherings and social distancing.

We are sincerely grateful to everyone who lent a hand, re-negotiated vendor contracts, re-planned cherished activities and helped brainstorm modification so that we could create another season of wonderful memories.

Merchandise Sales: First, a special thanks to Dede Consoli who moved forward with resilience, ingenuity, and who graciously sacrificed even more of her free time so that we could provide a safe shopping experience for our Quonnie residents. Thank you to her shed-genuity and to her expanded trusty sales crew for dedicating many hours every Sunday to the cause (not to mention the countless off-season hours in preparation). We are happy to report that we achieve a 17% growth over year 2019 sales. These funds allow us to support our events as well as other community projects including a \$15,000 donation to the community's Water issue. Thankfully, Dede generously has agreed to run merchandise sales next summer as well!

Expenses: A special thanks to Kathy Alperin for attentively serving as Treasurer for this group. While we had a short event list this year, the contractual deposits incurred as part of the delayed 90th Anniversary Dance will be applied towards the event date for year 2021. This was possible due to Kathy's diligence renegotiating these contracts starting last Spring so that we did not lose the funds. Thankfully, Kathy has also generously agreed to continue her management of our fund next year as well!

2020 Event Recap:

- July 4th Car Parade: This year's parade took on a different look to remain COVID-19 friendly. We enjoyed a rolling vehicle parade with a longer route to allow for increased participation and safe viewing from more Quonnie lawns passed.
